Light Rail Update | The chairperson updated the meeting on Light Rail developments: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • state government’s study to extend light rail to La Pouse; • relaxed parking space requirements on developments along the entire light rail corridor; • Special Infrastructure Cost (\$200 per square meter) causing increase to development costs; • state government push of its urban development agenda for the city to La Pouse corridor, first as Urban Activation Precincts, then as Priority Precincts, and now as South East Light Rail despite strong objections from the resident community; and • haste of the Government is push with light rail development has resulted in wanton destruction of century old fig trees, and now need for preservation of the massive Indigenous artefact find. |
