Council's request for rate increase in excess of 5 percent in the context of 2017-2018 budget surplus in excess of 13 percent	<b>RESOLUTION 18.01</b>  Precinct's position the Council's Rates Increase Survey Option 1: 2.3% capped increase – 5 votes Option 2: 3.52% increase – 6 votes Option 3: 5.5% with borrowings of \$27M NIL votes.  Gail Tring proposed a mail out to precinct mailing list as to their view on rates increase. Two members opposed as they thought members should attend meeting to vote. No vote was taken.
6. General Manager's disapproval of outcome of precinct AGM	The meeting sought clarification from the General Manager as his disapproval of outcome of precinct AGM held on 4th December 2017.  The General Manager agreed to approve the election of Jayasooriah to the position of Chairperson at the AGM.

General Business	a) DA 101/2018 – 11 Jeniffer St, Little Bay  Effect ESBS on the Commonwealth endangered species list, and excavation of rock shelf for carpark and the Headland water table.  <b>RESOLUTION 18.02</b>  The precinct is opposed to the development as inappropriate development for the area.  MOVED: Gary Dalton; SECONDED: Gail Tring; CARRIED  b) Bumborah Point  Charles Abela provided a brief history on the land which is elevated land above the inlet that it is part of Bicentennial Park and zoned as open space for recreational use.  Current proposal for Botany Cemetery to take over the land and have it rezoned has a lot of disadvantages – It is part of the coastal walkway and people would have to walk through the
