Issues arising from the minutes	<p>Gail Tring stated, the minutes read "did that survey involve anyone that is not a resident or rather owner of land" Gail said, "I don't think I said that, I said Ratepayer and own land".</p> <p>Minutes to be amended to read as "Ratepayer and own land".</p> <p>Resident asked for an update on Bumborah point whether there was any feedback regarding the cemetery taking over Bumborah point.</p> <p>Charles Abela provided an update on the Aboriginal Land Council and the Cemetary Trust. Charles made enquiries with Randwick Council, Manager of Strategic Planning regarding the cemetery trust.</p> <p>Issues are: Zoning change from Cemetery use being a prohibited use to allowing Cemetery use (spot rezoning) Rock shelf water runoff , water runoff from graves, leaching onto the beach, coastal walkway and public open space Charles Abele will lodge a submission to Council</p>

<p>from 27/04/18.</p>	<p>be bound by Council's Code of Conduct.</p> <p>Discussion on correspondence received from General Manager that Council has resolved that precincts are committees of council.</p> <p>Previous correspondence to the Dept of Local Government Correspondence received stated that council committees can be wholly advisory in nature or they can exercise functions of council. Legislation states if you exercise functions of council you are bound by the Code of Conduct. However if advisory you don't have to.</p> <p>Information received from Department of Local Government confirms that we are an advisory committee. As executives we are bound by precinct resolutions.
